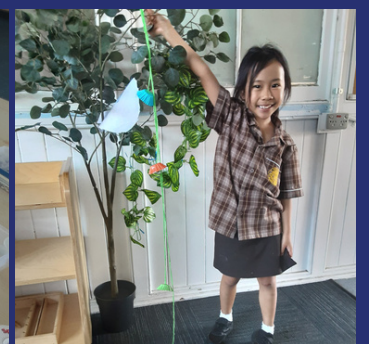

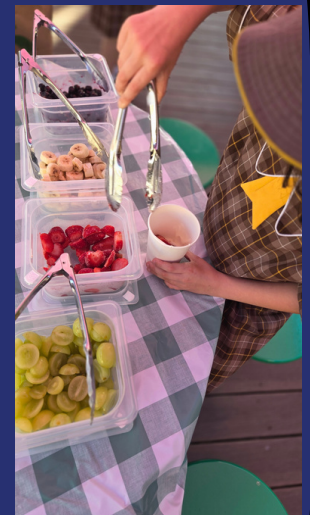
Term 3 Club Updates

VAC Swimming Forms

Health and Wellness
