#### **WKC Sunscreen Station**

Did you know that in the morning upon arrival at Wilston Kids Care, we have a Sunscreen Station set up for parents to access and apply sunscreen to their child. When you arrive at WKC, we ask that you apply sunscreen on your child when you sign them in.

If your child attends Before School Care, Sunscreen upon arrival is a parent's responsibility. As children arrive at different times through the morning and we are supervising children in various areas on offer across the school campus.

When the children are in our care in ASC, we put sunscreen on as soon as they arrive at 3pm. Sunscreen must be put on 20 minutes before going outdoors, to allow enough time for the ingredients to activate, to provide your child with full sun protection.

The same applies for when they sign in and in Vacation Care. We put sunscreen on children every 2-3 hours across the day. Again, we ask at drop off, for parents to manage sunscreen application as children arrive anywhere from 6.30am right through to 10am on school holidays.

Working together in partnership ensures good health and safety outcomes for your child.
